SUB: - CELEBRATION OF WORLD WATER DAY – 22 MARCH 2026.

Dear Sir/Madam,

Greetings from The Bharat Scouts and Guides, National Headquarters!

Every year, **World Water Day** is observed on **22 March 2026** to raise awareness about the importance of freshwater and to promote sustainable management of water resources. Water is one of the most precious natural resources, essential for life, health, and sustainable development.

In this regard, all State Associations are encouraged to organise activities to observe **World Water Day 2026** and create awareness among Scouts, Guides, Rovers, Rangers, Unit Leaders, and the community about the importance of water conservation and responsible water use. **The following activities are suggested hereunder:**

SL. NO.	Activities	Description
01.	Water Awareness Rally	Youth leaders organize a Water Awareness Rally in the school or community. Participants carry placards, banners, and posters with messages such as: “Save Water, Save Life” (पानी बचाओ, जीवन बचाओ) “Every Drop Counts” (हर बूँद कीमती है) “Water is Precious” (पानी अनमोल है) Participants chant slogans and distribute awareness leaflets about water conservation practices. The rally route may include school premises, nearby streets, and community areas to reach a larger audience.
02.	Street play on Water Conservation	Participants prepare and perform a short street play in markets, schools, park or community spaces. Themes may include: Future without water Stop wasting water Save water for the next generation The performance uses simple dialogues, songs, and slogans to convey the importance of saving water and preventing wastage.

03.	“Water Myth vs Fact” Social Media Campaign	<p>Youth create short social media posts, posters, or reels explaining common myths and facts about water.</p> <p>Example: Myth: Leaving the tap running for one-minute wastes very little water. Fact: It can waste more than 6 liters of water.</p> <p>Participants share these posts on school, individual, or community social media platforms.</p>
05.	Community Water Survey - Youth Water Detectives	<p>Youth leaders conduct a short survey in their locality or school. Questions may include:</p> <p>Do families practice water conservation? Are people aware of rainwater harvesting? How do households store and use water?</p> <p>The results are presented using charts, posters, or short presentations to raise awareness.</p>
06.	Sapling Plantation	<p>Participants plant trees near ponds, lakes, rivers, or school grounds. Youth leaders explain how trees:</p> <p>Improve groundwater recharge Prevent soil erosion Support biodiversity and natural ecosystems</p> <p>Participants take responsibility for watering and protecting the planted trees.</p>
07.	Door to door Campaign	<p>Youth visit homes in the community and explain easy methods to save water, such as:</p> <p>Turning off taps properly Repairing leaking pipes Using buckets instead of running hoses Reusing water for gardening</p> <p>Participants may distribute awareness leaflets or posters about water conservation.</p>
08.	storytelling or poetry	<p>Participants organize a storytelling or poetry session about water. Topics may include:</p> <p>Importance of rivers in our lives Traditional water conservation systems in India Stories about droughts or water scarcity</p> <p>Participants share personal experiences, poems, or folk stories related to water.</p>
09.	Community Art for Water Conservation	<p>Participants create a large mural or wall painting with messages such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “Every Drop Counts” • “Save Water for Future Generations” <p>The mural is painted in a school wall or community space.</p>

10.	Water Leadership Dialogue	Participants organize a youth dialogue or panel discussion on topics such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Water scarcity and climate change • Role of youth in water conservation • Sustainable water management Participants share ideas and propose community solutions aligned with Mission LiFE.
11.	Water Conservation Pledge	Youth leaders gather participants and conduct a Water Conservation Pledge Ceremony during assembly or community gatherings. <p>Participants repeat a pledge such as: “I pledge to save water, avoid wastage, and encourage others to protect this precious resource for a sustainable future.”</p> Participants can sign a Water Commitment Poster after taking the pledge


Through these activities, young members can actively contribute to protecting water resources and promoting sustainable practices within their communities.
