Host an exhibition featuring artwork, photography, essays, posters, or videos that showcase the aspirations, talents, and challenges of today's youth.

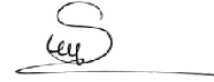
5. Youth Sustainability Campaign

Every Unit may undertake at least one meaningful act of community service benefiting society and demonstrating the true spirit of Scouting and Guiding.

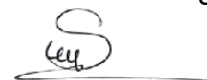
