Dear Sir/Madam,

Warm Greetings from the Bharat Scouts and Guides, National Headquarters!

The Friends of Asia Pacific WAGGGS (FAPW) was established in 1999 with the objective of raising funds to support the development of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting in the Asia Pacific Region. The fund primarily aims to strengthen the leadership, skills, and participation of girls and young women, enabling them to become confident leaders and active contributors to society.

The WAGGGS Asia Pacific Region is currently inviting applications for the following three projects funded by FAPW:

1. Project 3L – “Life-Long Learning”

Project 3L aims to empower girls and young women by providing opportunities to learn essential life skills and leadership competencies. The project focuses on enhancing the quality Girl Guiding experience and encouraging initiatives related to innovation, leadership, governance, STEM, nutrition, and social entrepreneurship.

- Maximum grant: GBP 3,000 per project
- Projects must be completed within 12 months of receiving the grant
- At least 50% of participants should be under 30 years of age

2. Project Reach Out

Project Reach Out is designed to strengthen collaboration and knowledge sharing among Member Organizations (MOs) in the Asia Pacific Region. The project must involve an exchange programme between two or more MOs, promoting leadership development, capacity building, and the WAGGGS Educational Method.

- Maximum grant: GBP 4,000 per project
- Projects should begin within 3 months of receiving the grant and be completed within 24 months.

3. Juseon Byun Leadership Fund – Young Women Projects

The Juseon Byun Leadership Fund (JBL Fund) was established to support young women leaders under the age of 30 to design and implement projects that strengthen leadership, governance participation, and decision-making roles within Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting.

- Individual grants range from GBP 500 to GBP 2,000
- Projects must be led by a young woman under 30 years of age
- Applications must be endorsed by the Member Organisation

State Associations are requested to circulate this information widely among members of the Guide Wing Units, and young women leaders, and encourage eligible Units/candidates to submit project proposals.

Interested Units/applicants should submit their complete application through their respective District, State Associations to the National Headquarters on or before **30th April 2026** at info@bsgindia.org

**GUIDELINES FOR ASIA PACIFIC REGION
PROJECT REACH OUT**
(Project funded by the Friends of Asia Pacific
WAGGGS)

BACKGROUND

Since 1999, Friends of Asia Pacific WAGGGS (FAPW) has gained enormous support from countries all over the world. FAPW works to raise funds for the development of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting in the Asia Pacific Region.

The AP Region Project Reach Out responds to the needs of the Asia Pacific Member Organisations (AP MOs) to share skills and knowledge that match the needs of other AP MOs. Projects must involve an exchange programme between two or more MOs in the AP Region that is in line with the WAGGGS Educational Method, strengthen the quality of Girl Guiding/Girl Scouting Experience and practice Leadership Model in at least one or all of the MOs involved.

GOALS

1. Strengthen organisational capacity of AP MOs in line with the Capacity Building Framework.
2. Strengthen relationships and international offers of AP MOs.
3. Create opportunities for AP MOs to share ideas, collaborate and support each other.

OBJECTIVES

1. To strengthen the capacity building of MOs in delivering their own strategic plan.
2. To help the Region deliver its Action Plan.
3. To encourage MOs to share skills, knowledge and expertise.
4. To support MOs to collaborate and connect with other MOs.

FUNDING

1. The maximum amount of grant per project is GBP 4,000.
2. Up to three project grants will be awarded per year.
3. Only the MO that submitted the application will receive the grant regardless of the number of MOs involved in the project and regardless of the number of beneficiaries.
4. Up to 40% of the grant may be used for travel expenses, administration and/or staff costs, if any.
5. Each Project Reach Out shall be funded once. The Member Organisation may choose to continue the project through self-funding or alternative funding arrangements.
6. Expenses exceeding the amount of the grant will be the responsibility of the applicant MO and the beneficiary MO/s.

CRITERIA

1. Projects should involve two or more MOs, or at least one applicant MO and one beneficiary MO.
2. Projects should contribute to strengthening the organisational capacity of the beneficiary MO in line with one or more elements of the Capacity Building Framework:
 - Organisational Identity
 - Organisational Structure and Management
 - Adults in Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting
 - Young People in Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting
 - Safe Space for all
3. Projects should follow the WAGGGS Educational Method and be examples of a high-quality Girl Guiding/Girl Scouting Experience that are Relevant, Exciting, Accessible and Learner-Led (REAL).
4. Projects should ensure that the participants develop and imbibe the WAGGGS Leadership Model.

PROCEDURE

1. Applications for the project must be submitted by 31 August of the preceding year. Only applications that meet the criteria will be considered. Once the quota of three projects has been reached, no further grants will be approved for the year and MOs will be informed to defer and submit the application the following year.
2. The APR Committee will select not more than three projects each year from the proposals submitted.
3. If a Member Organisation has already received a grant within the triennium, preference will be given to a Member Organisation that has not received a grant.
4. MO may choose to apply for a Project 3L grant OR Project Reach Out grant but not both grants in the same year.
5. Applicant MOs can apply for a new project upon completion of the current project and submission of the final report. MOs may also apply for a different Project Reach Out grant even during their time as a beneficiary MO.
6. Member Organisations will be notified by the APR Committee within 3 months of the deadline on the final decision made regarding the proposal submitted by the MOs.
7. Upon approval of the Project grant application and returning the signed agreement with the AP Region regarding the use of the grants, the grant will be sent only to the Applicant MO who has applied and is therefore the designated MO to receive the grant money in accordance with the agreement.
8. Within 2 months of completion of the project, Member Organisations must submit a final report using the template provided by the APR Committee. A copy of each report will be sent to the FAPW Working Group.
9. All Projects should begin within 3 months of receiving the grant and thereafter should be completed within 24 months. A mid-term report must be submitted 12 months after the start date. The final report on the project must be submitted within 2 months after the project's completion.

For example, if you receive the grant on 17 December 2024, you need to have started your project by 17 March 2025. If you started on 17 March 2025, you must submit a mid-term report by 17 March 2026. You need to have completed your Project by 17 March 2027, and submit the final report by 17 May 2027.

10. Member Organisations must complete the budget (included in the application form) while applying for the grant showing the breakdown for anticipated expenditures. A final report showing the breakdown for expenditures of the allotted grant as per actual expenditure should be submitted along with the project report. The format for the same will be provided.
11. MOs cannot apply for a new project unless they have submitted a report on their previous project. Furthermore, failure to comply with the deadline of reporting may bar the MOs from applying for other WAGGGS and FAPW grants in the future.
12. The APR Committee will monitor the progress of the project, ensuring that funds are used in accordance with the Project Reach Out Grant agreement between Member Organisation and APR Committee. A template for a midterm progress report and the final report will be sent to the Member Organisations. It is mandatory for MOs complete these reports and submit before deadlines in accordance with the Project Reach Out Grant Agreement.
13. Upon completion of the project, all Member Organisations that were involved in the project must collectively submit an article describing the project and the outcome. The article should comply with the requirements of GDPR (General Data Protection and Regulation). It will be edited and featured on WAGGGS communication channels. A guide containing the specifications of the article will be provided for this as well.
14. The recipients of the Project Reach Out Grant may be requested to present the Project at future AP Regional Conference(s) and FAPW events.
15. MOs are encouraged to give certificates of participation to participants of the project and the certificate template will be provided by the AP Regional Committee.

GUIDELINES FOR JUSEON BYUN LEADERSHIP FUND (Young Women Projects)

BACKGROUND

The Friends of Asia Pacific WAGGGS (FAPW) was established in 1999 to raise funds for the development of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting in the Asia Pacific Region. The funds enabled the Asia Pacific Region to deliver many more programmes and projects to its Member Organizations (MOs) and contributed to the region's increase in membership to become the largest and fastest growing region in WAGGGS.

In August 2019, the FAPW fully funded the AP Young Women Governance Workshop and launched the AP Young Women Ambassadors Programme. The FAPW Working Group saw the need to build upon and strengthen the leadership capacity of young women who exhibited great potential. They needed financial support to continue to develop their leadership skills and put them into action. A new leadership fund was set up for this purpose.

In November 2019, the FAPW successfully launched the FAPW Juseon Byun Leadership Fund (JBL Fund). The fund was named after the FAPW Founder Dato' Dr Juseon Byun, to honour and recognise her vision and life-long commitment in advancing young women in leadership through Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting.

GOALS

1. Demonstrate the WAGGGS Asia Pacific Region's commitment to young women's leadership development.
2. Facilitate the actualisation of young women in governance and decision making in MOs, Regional and WAGGGS levels.
3. Strengthen organisational capacity of AP MOs in line with the Capacity Building Framework.

OBJECTIVES

1. To strengthen the capacity building of young women in preparation for decision making and governance roles.
2. To retain capable young women in MOs, AP Region and WAGGGS by offering opportunities and support.
3. To encourage the girl-led culture and mindset within MOs.

FUNDING

The maximum amount that can be awarded by the JBL Fund is 25,000 GBP per triennium in total. This sum will be divided as described below, however there is room for change in how this is distributed as long as FAPW are advised of the change.

1. **Asia Pacific Regional Events:** the maximum grant amount is GBP 15, 000 per triennium for the coordination of up to two Regional training workshops which may be delivered in person, online, or a blend of both. (For the purpose of this grant, AP Regional Events are events organised by the AP Region and therefore this portion of the grant is only available to the AP Region and not individual MOs);
or
2. **Young Women Projects:** the maximum amount to be granted is GBP 10, 000 per triennium in total. Each individual grant will range between 500 – 2000 GBP and is only available to young women under 30 to implement projects advancing girls and young women in decision making, governance and leadership in their own countries. To be eligible for this grant, projects must have an endorsement from the relevant MO. Grant allocation will be decided upon by the Asia Pacific Regional Committee.

PROCEDURE

At the start of the triennium, the APR Committee will decide on the distribution of the 25,000GBP funding amongst Regional Events (including respective host countries) and Young Women's project grants and decide on the timelines for young women grant funding, the application period and convey the details to the Member Organizations. They will advise the FAPW Working Group of the decision.

** The below part contains the information in relation to the second part of the fund which is Young Women Projects.*

CRITERIA

Young Women's Project Grants:

1. Only Young Women who are members of an Asia Pacific MO can apply for a grant.
2. Projects should be led by a young woman with the approval of their MO.
3. Projects should aim to develop and strengthen leadership skills of young women and encourage them to take on decision making and governance roles within Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting and beyond.

4. Projects should contribute to the development of young women in at least two of the following:
 - a. Strategy and Planning
 - b. Governance
 - c. Leadership capacity building and the WAGGGS leadership model
 - d. Organisational Management
 - e. Influence and Advocacy
 - f. Finance and fundraising
5. Projects should be examples of high-quality Girl Guiding/Girl Scouting experience with methods that are Relevant, Exciting, Accessible and Learner-LED (REAL).
6. Projects should incorporate the applicable elements of the WAGGGS educational method:
 - a. Learning in small groups
 - b. Learning by doing
 - c. Connecting with others
 - d. Connecting with my world
 - e. My path, my pace
7. The action plan must be monitored by the MO in collaboration with the APR committee and delivered within 2 years of being awarded the grant.

Young Women Project Grants

1. Only applications that meet the criteria will be considered. A Budget needs to be included with the application. Once the maximum amount for the triennium has been granted, no further grants will be approved for the remainder of the triennium.
2. The APR Committee will select suitable projects each year from the proposals submitted by young women.
3. If an MO has already received a grant within the triennium, preference will be given to young women from other MOs that have not received a grant.
4. Young Women applicants and MOs will be notified about the decision by the APR Committee within 4 months from the application deadline.
5. Upon approval of the Project grant application, all necessary grant documents will be sent to the Young Woman and MO for their signatures and the grant will be transferred thereafter.
6. The Young Woman selects the account where she would prefer the funds to be transferred whether that be her own Account, Parents' Account, or the MO's Account.
7. Fund transfer needs to be confirmed by the fund receiver within 2 weeks of receipt. If the account belongs to the MO, they are expected to release the funds to the Young Woman within 2 weeks of the receipt or as per agreed arrangement with the young woman.

8. Upon completion of their project, Young Women should submit a complete report to the APR Committee using the template provided within 2 years of being awarded the funding with the endorsement from the respective MO. A copy of each report will be sent to the FAPW Working Group. Failure to submit a report may have a negative effect on future applications from the same MO.
9. The APR Committee through the assigned committee member, will monitor the progress of projects, ensuring that funds are used in accordance with the Young Women's project proposals submitted and approved by the APR Committee.
10. The APR Committee may, on a case-by-case basis, request for an update report before the submission deadline.
11. Upon completion of the project, WAGGGS will request Young Women Project Leads/MOs to submit a story featuring the project and the outcomes. The story should comply with the requirements of GDPR (General Data Protection and Regulation) and will be edited and featured in WAGGGS communication channels for e.g. FAPW newsletter 'Focus on Friends'. A guide containing the specifications of the story will also be provided by WAGGGS.
12. The relevant MOs may be requested to present their Project at the AP Regional Conference.
13. MOs are encouraged to give certificates of participation to participants of the projects and the certificate template will be provided by the AP Regional Committee.

GUIDELINES FOR ASIA PACIFIC REGION PROJECT 3L

Project 3L: “Life-Long Learning”

(Project funded by the Friends of Asia Pacific WAGGGS)

BACKGROUND

Since 1999, Friends of Asia Pacific WAGGGS (FAPW) has gained enormous support from countries all over the world. FAPW works to raise funds for the development of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting in the Asia Pacific Region. In line with the aim of FAPW, **Project 3L: “Life-Long Learning” (Project 3L)** was introduced to support projects that could contribute to the capacity building of girls and young women.

It is envisaged that Project 3L will give young women skills to use in all aspects of their life; not just those related to Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting. It aims to provide opportunities for Member Organisations (MOs) to hone quality Girl Experience by coming up with well-designed projects that focus on leadership and governance, opportunities for growth, safe space for girls, and a wider world impact.

GOALS

1. To empower girls and young women to learn life skills.
2. To contribute to the capacity building of girls and young women.
3. To provide opportunities to MOs to improve quality Girl Experience.
4. To support MOs develop leadership and governance skills, opportunities for growth, safe space for girls.

FUNDING

1. The maximum amount of grant per project is GBP 3,000.00.
2. Up to four (4) Project grants will be awarded per year.
3. Expenses over the amount of the grant will be the responsibility of the Member Organisation.
4. Up to thirty percent (30%) of the grant may be used for travel expenses, administration and/or staff costs, if any.

CRITERIA

1. All projects should incorporate applicable elements of WAGGGS Leadership Model and ensure Quality Girl Guide and Girl Scout Experience with methods that are Relevant, Exciting, Accessible and Learner-Led (REAL).
2. Projects can focus on any of the following areas:
 - Innovation and social entrepreneurship
 - STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics)
 - Nutrition
 - Leadership and Governance

3. All MOs should ensure the projects are conducted in a safe space for all participants.
4. At least 50% of the participants in each project must be members of the Member Organisation under the age of 30, with at least one project planning team member that falls under this age group.
5. The project may be conducted at any level of the MO (e.g. National, State, Province, Unit, Troop, etc.).
6. The project must be completed within 12 months upon receipt of the grant.
7. MOs cannot apply for a new project unless they have submitted the final report on their previous project. Furthermore, failure to comply with the deadline of reporting may prevent the MO from applying for other WAGGS and FAPW grants in the future.
8. The project with a sustainability plan will be prioritized during the selection process.
9. Each project will receive funding only once for Project 3L. The Member Organisation may choose to continue the project through self-funding or alternative funding arrangements.
10. In case the proposed project falls under the ongoing programme of the MO, it must target new beneficiaries to be eligible. Such a project can receive the grant from Project 3L only once to strengthen and amplify its impact. Application for the same project, even if it reaches out to new beneficiaries, will not be eligible for a second grant.
11. MO may choose to apply for a Project 3L grant OR Project Reach Out grant but not both grants in the same year.

PROCEDURE

1. Applications for the project must be submitted by 31 August of the preceding year. Only applications that meet the criteria will be considered.
2. The APR Committee will select up to four (4) projects each year from the proposals submitted by Member Organisations.
3. If a Member Organisation has already received a grant within the triennium, preference will be given to a Member Organisation that has not received a grant.
4. Member Organisations will be notified by the APR Committee within three (3) months from the deadline as to whether their application has been approved.
5. Prior to receipt of the amount of the grant, Member Organisations must sign a grant letter and agree to the terms and conditions of the grant.
6. The APR Committee will monitor the progress of the project, ensuring that funds are used in accordance with the Project 3L Grant agreement between Member Organisation and APR Committee. A template for a mid-term progress report will be sent to the Member Organisations. All MOs must submit the mid-term report within the seventh month of the project period.

7. Member Organisations must complete the budget (included in the application form) while applying for the grant showing the breakdown for anticipated expenditures. A final report showing the breakdown for expenditures of the allotted grant as per actual expenditure should be submitted along with the project report. The format for the same will be provided.
8. Within two months of completion of the project, Member Organisations must submit a complete report using the template provided by APR Committee. A copy of each report will be sent to FAPW Working Group.
9. Upon completion of the project, Member Organisations must submit an article describing the project and the outcome. The article should comply with the requirements of GDPR (General Data Protection and Regulation). It will be edited and featured on WAGGGS communication channels. A guide containing the specifications of the article will be provided.
10. The recipients of the Project 3L Grant may be requested to present the Project at future AP Regional Conference(s) and FAPW events.
11. MOs are encouraged to give certificates of participation to participants of the projects and the certificate template will be provided by the AP Regional Committee.

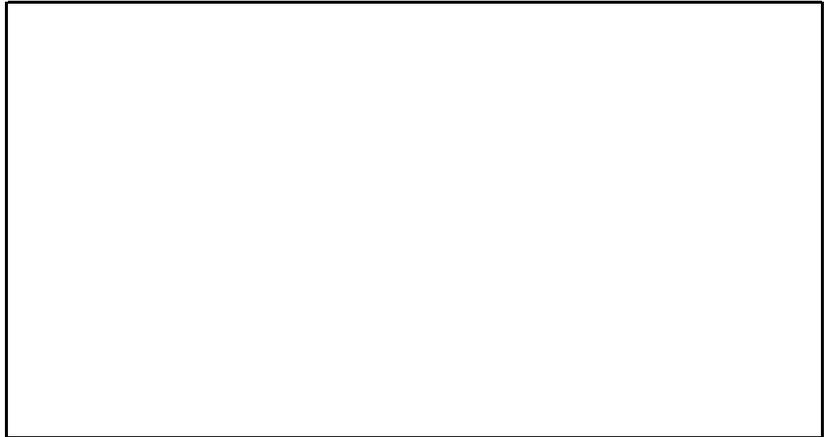

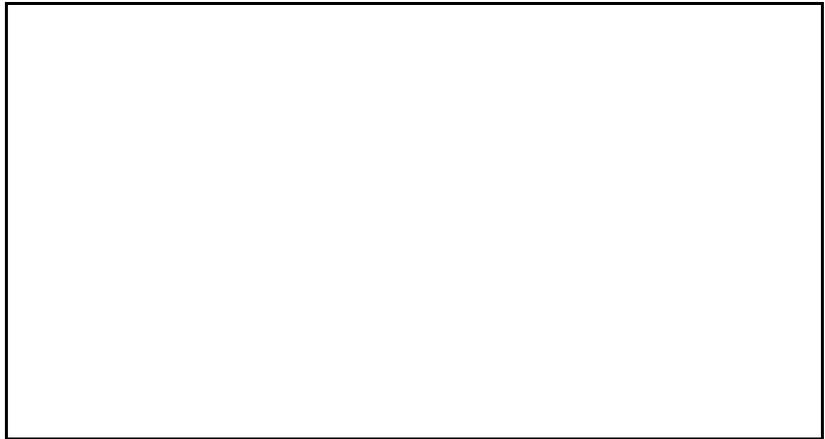

The nominated candidates will have to register themselves directly on the portal and bear all the expenses either personally or through their sponsoring authority.

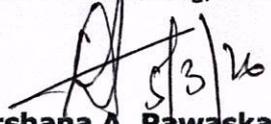
The last date for online registration is 10.03.2026. The National Headquarters will block the seats based on the nominations received from your State Association.
